No better background information on the Chinese economy can be found than in the studies prepared for the Joint Economic Committee of the U.S. Congress in 1967, 1972 and 1975 respectively. The Central Intelligence Agency has published two useful "research aids," the *People's Republic of China: International Trade Handbook and Foreign Trade in Machinery and Equipment, June 1972*, which are useful statistical compendia. For current information on the China trade, the *Bulletin of the Sino-British Trade Council*, the *China Trade Report* and the *U.S.-China Business Review* are useful, and the *Far Eastern Economic Review* must also be highly recommended. The two books reviewed here may be appealing to the general reader tempted by the breadth of their titles, but the extra effort of looking for and using the sources mentioned in this paragraph will yield him more useful information.

China's Foreign Trade Statistics, 1864-1949. By HSIAO LIANG-LIN. [Cambridge, Mass., and London: Harvard University Press, 1974. East Asian Monographs 56. 297 pp. \$9.00. £4-95.]

When invited to write a review of a study of China's foreign trade statistics, I did not expect to be preparing a critical evaluation of almost 300 pages of numbers. Yet, in preparing my review of Hsiao's summary reproduction of the most important data published in the annual reports of the Chinese Maritime Customs (CMC), I came to appreciate the value of his contribution to those of us who will find this book very useful in our own research.

Following the organization of the data in the original CMC reports, annual data for 1864-1941 and 1946-48 are presented for total imports and exports, principal import and export commodities (41 imports and 53 exports), the trade in gold and silver, customs revenue, the distribution of exports and imports by country and by ports, foreign exchange rates, and shipping statistics according to the flag of the carrier. All these data come directly from the original CMC reports. The only data not taken directly from the CMC reports are the author's own adjusted estimates of China's total imports and exports; the Nankai Institute of Economics' index numbers for the quantities and prices of imports and exports, and barter terms of trade; and the available estimates for China's balance of payments for 13 different years after the turn of the century.
